Nicole took to the helm co-coordinating team games and -conducting art activities her children participated children much to the delight of the football fanatics boys and girls alike.







Camera Corps - Whilst Camera Corps were in Brazil to cover the Olympic and Paralympic Games, Megan Lloyd Johnson, Chris Taber, Steve Lintern and Joe Gee visited Casa Jimmy to make a documentary film portraying Task Brasil Trust and our current projects. The donation has already had a substantial impact and enabled us to employ a psycho-educationalist. **Thiago**, who is a musicologist and already doing a great work with the children, is teaching them to play the guitar as well. Thiago is able to help diagnose signs of late development in the children that can then be addressed by liaising with their schools and family. In addition, the donation has enabled us to employ a replacement sports instructor and also to carry out much needed repairs to the swimming pool on the grounds of Casa Jimmy.

### Activities in Casa Jimmy

Various workshops take place all year round. One of the most recent consisted of the youngsters (11-17) making a geography presentation all about the cause and effect of the urban and rural exodus in Brazil. On another occasion the kids researched and presented to the group about the different sports at the Paralympic Games in 2016. Also the 6-10 year olds have benefited greatly by addressing developmental traits such as shyness, verbal communication skills, teamwork, respect for others and individual development.







- \* Project Stepping Stone advises and supports past residents in addition to current beneficiaries and their families. This enables our beneficiaries to maintain continuous access to local support networks, assisting an inclusive family life in a home and avoiding in the worst case, a return to living on the streets.
- \* Project Crescer reaches Rio's poorest and most disadvantaged children and supports their growth through formal and informal education. It provides out-of-school workshops in a variety of subjects including English, IT, incomegenerating skills, communication and introductory finance which equip young people with the necessary tools to have better prospects and thrive in life.

Cidadania - The 'cidadania' workshops explore important subject matters with subjects ranging from various health to social issues.

In light of the recent spate of Dengue, Zika and chikungunya outbreaks the team at Casa Jimmy held a workshop on the mosquito borne infectious diseases to raise aware-



ness amongst the children, some of which had already fallen victim to or have had family members and friends who had contracted the diseases.

The workshop was well received by the children who in turn explored creative ways to promote their understanding of the diseases via posters.

Hair workshop - Pamela, also known by her you tube name 'La negra Loca, is a beauty blogger, professional educator and motivational speaker who brought her unique teaching methods to the project.

Pamela's invitation was borne out of an amalgamation of various factors, the chief one being to combat the negative stereotypes of beauty promoted within Brazilian society regarding people of Afro-Brazilian ancestry. In light of Black Consciousness Day which took place a short while before her visit and the fact that many of the children attending the project are of Afro-Brazilian descent, Pamela, in her inimitable style, mounted a hair/turban workshop addressing some of the aesthetic challenges faced by the children and created a positive ambiance of self esteem amongst the beneficiaries.

Mother's Day Celebration — At the beginning of May Task Brasil laid on a coffee morning at Casa Jimmy for the beneficiaries, their mothers and guardians to celebrate 'O Dia das Mães' (Mother's Day).

The children put on a song and dance repertoire for their mothers and guardians and who were served a selection of snacks.

It also proved a welcome opportunity for the staff at Casa Jimmy to further strengthen their relationship with the beneficiaries' mothers and guardians.

## Case Studies

Project Crescer Yan da Silva Almeida enrolled in Project Crescer in April 2012, at 9 years of age. At the time of registration his mother reported that, Yan was a child with reading difficulties, had no concentration at school and experienced great difficulty in creating bonds of friendship with other children. Upon assessment Yan was forwarded to the public service network.

Yan currently interacts well with other children at school and at Casa Jimmy. He has been improving at school, we have followed his progress through her school report card.





Yan's Sister Thays, started in the project in March 2013, at the age of 6 and was a very quiet child. She has since made significant progress in social development and takes part in all activities. At school she has good grades and is very well behaved.

# Aims for 2017

- ◆ Expand Casa Jimmy so Project Crescer can cater for kids 6 to 18 years old 7 days per week from 7 to 7pm.
- ♦ Offer Task Brasil's ex-residents and their families, through Project Stepping Stone, additional support to meet their daily needs, in order to keep them away from the streets.
- Offer the Casa Jimmy beneficiaries swimming lessons.
- ◆ Increase the number of events, donations and monthly sponsors to boost Task Brasil's regular income.
- Increase the income raised through fundraising campaigns.
